Spokane House Camp Living History Policies (updated 1/10/01)

1. All period clothing, equipment, and accoutrements must be consistent with the historical period 1810-25 at Spokane House. Individual camps should represent living quarters and not trade centers.

2. Pets are not allowed in the camp without written approval.

3. All participants must be able to greet the public with appropriate demeanor during the hours the encampment site is open to the public.

4. The use of period clothing within the encampment area will be limited to approved participants and the Riverside State Park employees and volunteers.

5. The public will not be allowed to handle firearms or edged weapons.
