Visit the years 1810-1826 at the Spokane House
Riverside State Park - Nine Mile Falls, WA

Events are Free to the Public. Both days are "Free Days in the Park" at the Fur Trade Encampment
Saturday 10am-5pm & Sunday 10am-4pm.

The Saturday Symposium is from 11 am to 3 pm

The events are a partnership with Washington State Parks and Friends of Spokane House

Visit the Spokane House Interpretive Center (SHIC) then proceed to the recreated camps of the Northwest Co. and the Hudson Bay Co. Watch the demonstrations: starting fire with flint & steel; flintlock loading & shooting. Visit with traders, blacksmiths, fur trappers, free hunters and voyageurs and visit the Indian "daughters of the country."

Meet members of the Spokane Tribe of Indians whose ancestors have lived in this area for thousands of years prior to contact with Euro-Americans. Visit their tipi and see their artifacts. Enjoy the trading post featuring items for sale from the era.



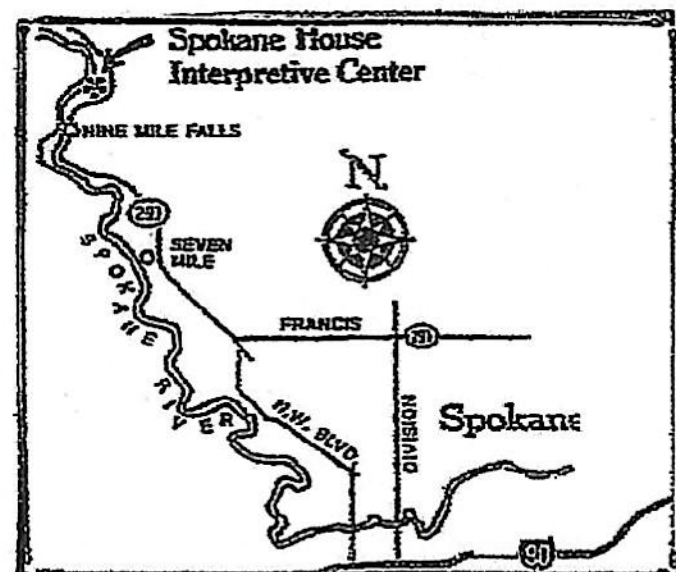
Fur Trade Symposium - Saturday
